### EAST SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962

##### *East Suffolk County Development Plan (Review of Lowestoft Town Map)*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment has given further consideration to the proposals for alterations and additions to the East Suffolk County Development Plan (Review of the Lowestoft Town Map) submitted by the Council on 31st January 1967 and relating to land at Lowestoft and the immediately surrounding area.

A list of the Secretary of State's proposed modifications to the submitted review Town Map was published in December 1969. Based on information now before him, the Secretary of State considers that the proposals should be further modified as follows:—

<i>Modification No.</i>	<i>Description of Modification</i>	<i>Reason for Modification</i>
47	In the Written Statement: Para. 10(i): Amend the last sentence to read: "This road will eventually replace the A12 Trunk Road, but it is unlikely to be constructed before the latter part of the plan period and its status will be reviewed at that time." Para. 63: Delete first two items and substitute: "Bloodmoor Road, and Bloodmoor Road/A12 surface level roundabout." Para. 68: Delete and substitute: "Stages of the Town Spine Road leading up to but probably not including the proposed crossing of Lake Lothing should be constructed during this period. These additions to the highway framework together with improvements carried out during the first phase will enable progressive improvements in the main distributory system to be achieved together with continuing rationalisation of the road systems of the environmental areas. The Carlton Colville By-pass should be constructed towards the end of the period."	To clarify the status and programming of the Town Spine Road. " "

Any objections to the proposed modifications should be sent in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 24th June 1971 and should state in full the reasons for the objections and identify the land to which they relate.

Objections which relate either to the Council's original proposals, or to the modifications previously published, or to the Secretary of State's failure to make a modification, will not be entertained by the Secretary of State.

##### *Notice of Modification of Draft Map*

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by subsection (3) of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Rights of Way Map and Statement prepared under section 27 of the above-mentioned Act, in relation to the rights of way within the area of the Rural District of Chapel-en-le-Frith by:

- (i) The deletion of the paths indicated in the First Schedule hereto;
- (ii) The inclusion of the paths indicated in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (iii) Changing the status with extensions or variations in line as indicated in the Third Schedule hereto;
- (iv) Amending the wording of the Statements as indicated in the Fourth Schedule hereto;

Maps and a copy of this notice with Schedules showing these modifications have been deposited at the offices of the Derbyshire County Council (Room 130), Smedley Street, Matlock, where they may be seen free of charge during usual office hours, 9 a.m.

to 5 p.m., and similarly at the Chapel-en-le-Frith Rural District Council Offices, Hayfield Road, Chapel-en-le-Frith, but from 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. (except Whit Monday, 31st May), or by arrangement with the Clerk of the Council concerned.

Relevant extracts from the draft map and statement have also been lodged with the various Parish Councils concerned or, where appropriate, with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting, and these extracts may be inspected by appointment with the Clerk of the appropriate Parish Council or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting.

Any representation or objection with respect to these determinations shall be made in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the Derbyshire County Council, County Offices, Matlock, Derbyshire DE4 3AG, not later than 28 days after the publication of this notice, and shall state the grounds on which it is made.

##### *National Grid References*

The description of the paths include the National Grid Map reference of the path thus (GR.103724) so that the paths can be identified on most post-war Ordnance Survey Maps of all scales. The references are for general guidance only and are only precise to the nearest 100 metres on the 1" scale.

The draft map shows the position as at relevant date, viz., 1st June 1954, and subsequent creations, closures and diversions of public paths in pursuance of statutory powers are not shown.
