

The Order becomes operative as from the 28th day of August, 1953, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

CHESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL.

Survey of Public Rights of Way.

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Cheshire County Council have prepared, in accordance with the provisions of Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, draft maps and statements showing the public rights of way which in their opinion subsisted, or were reasonably alleged to subsist, on the 1st June, 1953, in the parts of the Administrative County of Chester comprised by the county districts set out in paragraph 2 (b) below.
