CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL.

Survey of Public Rights of Way.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Map and Statement showing all public rights of way in the Urban District of Camborne-Redruth which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st July, 1954, have now been prepared and are available for inspection at my office at the County Hall, Truro. A copy of the Draft Map and Statement is also available for inspection at the Offices of the Camborne-Redruth Urban District Council at Camborne.

Representations or objections in respect of the Draft Map and Statement may be made at any time during the period ending on the 31st January, 1955. Such representations or objections must be in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Truro, and must state the grounds on which they are made.

A representation or objection that an additional path (or paths) subsists should state the points between which it is alleged to subsist and define the route.

It will greatly help all concerned if representations or objections regarding more than one path are made on separate sheets of paper and followed (where there is objection to a path shown on the Draft Map) by the number on the Map against the path in question.

Thundridge Public Path Order, 1954.

BRENTWOOD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Salmonds Farm Ingrave Footpath Diversion Order, 1954.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 11th day of September, 1954, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running diagonally in a north easterly direction across the field adjacent to and to the north of Salmonds Farm House Ingrave from a point marked "C" on the map attached to the Order at its junction with the footpath running from Middle Road to Ingrave Church approximately 266 yards to a point marked "A" on the map attached to the Order to a new path running from the aforesaid point "A" in a westerly direction adjacent to the southern side of the fence which

forms the northern boundary of the field crossed by the existing footpath and numbered 167 on the map attached to the Order to the point of its new junction with the footpath running from Middle Road to Ingrave Church and marked "B" on the map being approximately fourteen yards from the rear of the property known as 39 Middle Road Ingrave and having a width of six feet at which point a stile is to be erected.

The old right of way becomes extinguished on the 9th day of October, 1954, and the new right of way comes into existence on the 2nd day of October, 1954.

A certified copy of the Order and the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Brentwood, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m., and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 25th day of September, 1954, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

THURROCK URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Thurrock Urban District Council (Footpath between London-Tilbury Road (A.13) and a point East of Hilltop Road, West Thurrock) Diversion Order, 1954.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 9th day of September, 1954, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right-of-way running from a point on the London-Tilbury Road (A.13) approximately 320 yards West of Nine Acre Shaw in a South-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 940 yards and thence in a Southerly direction for a distance of approximately 577 yards to a point approximately 170 yards East of the Northern end of Hilltop Road to a line running from a point on the said London-Tilbury Road adjoining the Ockendon Branch Railway Line alongside the Western boundary of the said Railway Line for a distance of approximately 1,560 yards and thence in a Westerly direction for a distance of approximately 350 yards to the said point approximately 170 yards East of the Northern end of Hilltop Road.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Thurrock Urban District Council at Whitehall Lane, Grays, Essex, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 1st day of October, 1954, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
