

The Order relates to land situate in the parish of Hampton in the Borough of Evesham.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from a point 220 feet north of the road running from Pershore to Evesham and thence along the banks of the rivers Isbourne and Avon for a distance of approximately 485 feet to a line running from the said point 220 feet north of the road running from Pershore to Evesham and thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of the field known as Hampton Playing Field for a distance of approximately 475 feet.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF EPPING.

Rural District Council of Epping (Potter Street) Extinguishment Order, 1954.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 2nd day of December, 1954, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above order.

The effect of the order is to extinguish the public right-of-way which commences at a point on the eastern side of the London-Cambridge Road A.11 at Potter Street, Harlow, in the county of Essex, immediately south of Parsons and Parsons Garage (in the north-west corner of enclosure No. 485 Ordnance Survey Sheet Essex NL11.9 Edition of 1920) and runs in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 195 yards until it joins a path running alongside the western boundary of Harlow Park (in the south-east corner of the aforesaid enclosure No. 485). The extinguishment will take effect at the expiration of twenty-one days from the date of the confirmation of the order.

A certified copy of the order and of the map contained in the order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Rural District Council Offices, 209, High Street, Epping, Essex, and will be open for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

The order becomes operative as from the 10th day of December, 1954, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
