PLOUGHLEY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Ploughley Rural District Council (Mixbury No. 1)
Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 30th day of June, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above order.

The effect of the order is to divert the public right of way running from the West corner of O.S. 63 (Oxfordshire Sheets XI/11 and XI/15 1922 Editions) in a south easterly direction to Mixbury Lodge, Mixbury, Oxford and thence to the Westbury Road, to a line running from the west corner of O.S. 63 to the east corner of the said field adjoining Westbury Road, Mixbury. The existing footpath will be closed on the 6th August, 1955.

A certified copy of the order and of the map contained in the order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Waverley House, Bicester, Oxon, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The order becomes operative as from the 22nd day of July, 1955, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BARNSELY.

County Borough of Barnsley (Round Green)
Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 12th day of July, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert so much of the public right of way running from Green Lane to Round Green Lane as lies between the north bank of Brough Green Brook and Round Green Lane and to substitute therefor a new public right of way on foot along the south bank of Brough Green Brook for 415 feet in a westerly direction, and thence in a straight line running approximately south west to a wicket gate in Round Green Lane approximately 357 feet north west of the junction between Round Green Lane and the old path. The old path is to be closed on the 17th August, 1955.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the undermentioned places and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.:

The Order becomes operative as from the 17th day of August, 1955, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.—
