## RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF CHELTENHAM.

*Cheltenham Rural District Council (The Rivelands Footpath, Swindon) Diversion Order, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 2nd day of February, 1956, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following parish, namely the Parish of Swindon.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way over the path running in a northerly direction through the enclosure called "The Rivelands", number 77 on the Ordnance Survey Map for Gloucestershire Sheet XIX. 15, 1923 Edition,

from the gate or gap in the southern boundary fence of the said enclosure adjoining the north west corner of Swindon Village School proceeding northwards through the said enclosure to the gate or gap in the north-eastern boundary hedge or fence on the south side of Quat Goose Road near the point where the latter is joined by the lane from Brockhampton;

to a new line commencing at the gate or gap in the southern boundary fence of the said enclosure adjoining the north-west corner of Swindon Village School proceeding north-westwards close to and along the boundary fence of the said enclosure then turning north-eastwards and proceeding close to and along the fence which runs through the said enclosure from south-west to north-east until it meets the existing path at or near the gate or gap in the north-eastern boundary fence or hedge on the south side of Quat Goose Road near the point where the latter is joined by the lane to Brockhampton.

A certified copy of the Order and of the Map contained in the Order has been deposited at Swindon Village Post Office and at the offices of the Cheltenham Rural District Council, 14, Imperial Square, Cheltenham and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9.15 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. each weekday except Saturdays, and between the hours of 9.15 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 30th day of April, 1956 and any such objection or representation should state the ground on which it is made.

## CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL.

*Survey of Public Rights of Way: Rural District of Liskeard.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Map and Statement showing all public rights of way in the Rural District of Liskeard which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st January, 1956, have now been prepared and are available for inspection at my office at the County Hall, Truro.

A copy of the Draft Map and Statement is available for inspection at the offices of the Liskeard Rural District Council at Luxstowe House, Liskeard, and extracts relating to each Parish in the Rural District are available in those Parishes by arrangement with the Parish Clerk or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting.

Representations or objections in respect of the Draft Map and Statement may be made at any time during the period ending on the 31st July, 1956. Such representations or objections must be in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Truro, and must state the grounds on which they are made.

A representation or objection that an additional path (or paths) subsists should state the points between which it is alleged to subsist and define the route.

It will greatly help all concerned if representations or objections regarding more than one path are made on separate sheets of paper headed with the name of the Parish and followed (where there is objection to a path shown on the Draft Map) by the number shown on that map against the path in question.

## CITY OF LINCOLN.

*The City of Lincoln Long Leys Road Diversion Order, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 9th day of March, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from a point on the Northern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 94 (Sheet LXX2 Lincolnshire 1932 Edition) through the said field to the South-East corner thereof to a line running from the said point on the Northern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 94 along the Southern boundary of the land occupied by the Lincoln Isolation and Chest Hospital and along part of the Western boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 100 (Sheet LXX2 Lincolnshire 1932 Edition) to the South-East corner of the said Ordnance Survey Field Number 94. The diversion will take place and the original right of way will be extinguished on the 30th day of March, 1956, on which date the new right of way will be available to the public.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office, Saltergate, Lincoln, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 27th day of March, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
