TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1950.

Bovingdon Green, Great Marlow, Footpath Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 11th day of July, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed (with modifications) the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running in a northerly direction from a stile at a point on the eastern boundary of field No. 454, O.S. Bucks Sheet No. LI.4 (1925 Edition), and marked "B" on the map contained in the Order, for a distance of 810 feet or thereabouts, to a point where it terminates at its junction with the public right of way leading to Bovingdon Green and marked "A" on the said map, to a line running in a north-easterly direction from the said stile at the same point "B" and following the eastern boundary of the said field No. 454 for a distance of 955 feet or thereabouts, to a point marked "C" on the said map, and then continuing to follow the boundary of the said field No. 454 in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 125 feet or thereabouts, to a point where it terminates at its junction with the public right of way aforementioned and marked "D" on the said map.

The existing right of way will be extinguished on the 16th day of August, 1956, and as from that date the path will be closed to the use of the public.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, 17, High Street, High Wycombe, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays and between 9 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 27th day of July, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof

or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of the publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
