

**NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF DEBEN.

(Parish of Newbourn No. 1) Diversion Order, 1956.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 10th day of October, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from a point approximately 44 yards south from the north west corner of enclosure numbered 8 on the Ordnance Survey Map for the Parish of Newbourn and approximately 144 yards south of the southernmost point of Foxburrow Plantation in the Parish of Brightwell running in an east south east direction for a distance of approximately 596 yards across the said enclosure numbered 8 to a point on the Eastern boundary of the said enclosure being approximately 120 yards south of the north eastern corner of that enclosure and approximately 100 yards south of the south western corner of Alder Carr to a line running from a point on the Western boundary of the said enclosure numbered 8 situate approximately 7 yards south of the north west corner of that enclosure and approximately 114 yards south of the southernmost point of the said Foxburrow Plantation and running in an east south east direction for a distance of approximately 617 yards across the said enclosure to a point on the western boundary of that enclosure situate approximately 59 yards south of its north east corner and approximately 40 yards south of the south west corner of Alder Carr then turning due south for a distance of approximately 60 yards along the eastern boundary of the enclosure there rejoining the existing path. The new path comes into use on the 8th November, 1956.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Melton Hill, Woodbridge, and will be open for inspection free of charge from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and 9 a.m. to 12 noon Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 26th day of October, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court. At any time within twenty-eight days after the publication of this notice, the owner lessee or occupier of any land shown on any such provisional map, being land on which the map shows a public path, or a road used as a public path, who disputes the Provisional Map and Statement may apply to Quarter Sessions for a declaration in accordance with Section 31 of the said Act.

Notice of any such application should be addressed in respect of land situate within the Borough of New Windsor, to the Clerk of the Peace, 16, Sheet Street, Windsor, and within the remaining boroughs and the rural districts above mentioned, to the Clerk of the Peace, Shire Hall, Reading, and should be made in accordance with the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations 1952 (S.I. 1952 No. 559).

*The County of the Isle of Wight (Northcourt Down,
Shorwell) Extinguishment Order, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Order was made on the 23rd day of October, 1956, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation. The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Shorwell.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish public right of way No. SW. 50 which leads from the junction of paths numbered SW. 48 and CW. 50 to the east of Cheverton Farm, Cheverton Shute, Shorwell, south eastwards across Ordnance Parcels No. 15 and No. 31 at Northcourt Down, Shorwell, I.W., for a distance of 2,970 feet to the junction with Bridle Road No. SW. 49 on Northcourt Down, Shorwell, I.W. (All references to Ordnance Survey 1908—Sheet Nos. XCIV. 16 and XCVII. 4.)

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the County Hall, Newport, I.W. (Room 31) and will be open for inspection during office hours.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 24th day of November, 1956, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
