Survey of Public Rights of Way.

NOTICE is hereby given that pursuant to Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, the Somerset County Council have carried out a survey of all lands within the area of Bridgwater borough and Bridgwater rural district in the County of Somerset over which a right of way is alleged to subsist and have prepared a draft map and statement showing and describing all public rights of way which in their opinion subsisted or were reasonably alleged to subsist on the 5th September, 1955.

BOROUGH OF REIGATE.

Reigate Borough (Holmethorpe) Public Footpath Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 31st day of January, 1956, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from Nutfield Road to Frenches Road through fields Nos. 119, 120 and 121 on Surrey Sheets XXVI.12 and XXVI.16 of the Ordnance Survey 1933 Revision, shewn coloured green on the map contained in the Order, to a line running from Nutfield Road to Frenches Road through fields Nos. 44 and 121 on Surrey Sheet XXVI.12 of the above mentioned Ordnance Survey Sheet, coloured red on the said map contained in the Order. The existing public right of way will be extinguished ten weeks after the date of confirmation of the Order, namely, the 31st January, 1956.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Town Hall, Reigate, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays).

The Order becomes operative as from the 10th day of February, 1956, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
