Survey of Public Rights of Way

NOTICE is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Sub-section (3) of Section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Map and Statements prepared under Section 27 of the above-mentioned Act in relation to the Rights of Way within the area of the Municipal Borough of Helston in the County of Cornwall by:—

(1) the deletion of the paths indicated in the First Schedule hereto;

(2) the amendment of the paths indicated in the Second Schedule hereto.

Maps and Statements showing these modifications have been deposited at the office of the Town Clerk, The Guildhall, Helston and at the office of the County Planning Officer, County Hall, Truro, where they may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

George Lane Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1957.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 1st day of May, 1957, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish at the expiration of twenty-one days from the said 1st day of May, 1957, the public right of way running from the South side of George Lane, Hayes, Bromley, adjacent to the West boundary of No. 48, George Lane in a southerly direction for approximately 47 yards and then South-East for approximately 23 yards to the gate of Hayes County Primary School.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Municipal Offices, Bromley, and will be open for inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 10th day of May, 1957, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

Draft Map of Rights of Way for parts of the Administrative County of Stafford.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Staffordshire County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 29 (3) of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949 have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Rights of Way Map and Statement prepared under Section 27 of the said Act in relation to the rights of way within the area of the Staffordshire County Council in the following manner:—

(a) by the deletion of or modification of status of certain public paths being footpaths situate in the following localities:—

In the parishes of Abbots Bromley, Croxden, Kingstone, Newborough, Ramshorn, Stanton, Wootton and Uttoxeter Rural in the Rural District of Uttoxeter.

(b) by the addition of certain ways to be shown in the Draft Rights of Way Map as footpaths or bridleways situate in the following localities:—

In the Urban District of Uttoxeter.

In the parishes of Abbots Bromley, Croxden, Denstone, Ellastone, Kingstone, Leigh, Marchington, Okeover, Ramshorn, Stanton and Uttoxeter Rural in the Rural District of Uttoxeter.

These modifications are shown on a Map which has been deposited at the office of the Clerk of the County Council, County Buildings, Stafford and which may be seen there free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays).
