Part IV: Survey of Public Rights of Way.

*Urban District of Newquay.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Map and Statement showing all public rights of way in the Urban District of Newquay which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st day of April, 1957, have now been prepared, and are available for inspection at my office at the County Hall, Truro.

A copy of the draft map and statement relating to the above-mentioned area is also available for inspection at the office of the Clerk to the Urban District Council, Council Chambers, Newquay, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Representations or objections in respect of the draft map and statement may be made at any time during the period ending on the 30th September, 1957. Such representations or objections must be in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Truro, and must state the grounds on which they are made.

A representation or objection that an additional path (or paths) subsists should state the points between which it is alleged to subsist, and define the route.

It will greatly help all concerned if representations or objections regarding more than one path are made on separate sheets of paper headed with the name of the Local Authority, and followed (where there is objection to a path shown on the draft map) by the number on the map against the path in question.

STROOD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Strood Rural District (Shorne) No. 1 Footpath  
Diversion Order, 1957.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 3rd day of May, 1957, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications, the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to create a public right of way on foot over land situate in the Parish of Shorne, commencing at a point 135 feet North West of Shorne Mill and thence running in a

Northerly direction along the Eastern boundary of Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 109 Kent Sheet X-16 (1933 Edition), measuring in length 500 feet or thereabouts to join Cart Road Footpath No. 16 at a point 265 feet or thereabouts West of Crown Lane, and to extinguish the public right of way commencing at a point 135 feet North West of Shorne Mill and thence running in a North Westerly direction across Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 109 Kent Sheet X-16 (1933 Edition) to the Northern boundary of Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 109, measuring in length 725 feet or thereabouts, to join Cart Road Footpath No. 16 at a point 743 feet or thereabouts West of Crown Lane at the expiration of 56 days from the date of confirmation of the Order, i.e., 29th June, 1957.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister, has been deposited at the Council Offices, Frindsbury Hill, Strood, Kent, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays, and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 17th day of May, 1957, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may within six weeks of the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL.

*The County of Derby (Waingroves Road, Ripley)  
Footpath Diversion Order, 1957.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 3rd day of May, 1957, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Waingroves Ward of the Urban District of Ripley in the County of Derby.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish that part of the public right of way running from Waingroves Road, Ripley to West Hill, Codnor which extends from a point approximately 100 yards east of its junction with Waingroves Road in an east-south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 150 yards, and to create a new public right of way of a width of six feet and a length of approximately 303 yards from the existing stile on the eastern boundary of the school playing fields around the southern boundary of the playing fields so that the new public right of way joins Waingroves Road at a point approximately 85 yards south of the existing junction.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Town Hall, Ripley and at the County Offices, St. Mary's Gate, Derby and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 17th day of June, 1957, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
