Applications to Quarter Sessions should be in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Truro, and should reach him not later than the 14th September, 1957. Any such applications should be made in accordance with The Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions), Regulations, 1952, and sections 29 to 31 of the above-named Act.
