NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Maps and Statements showing all public rights of way in the Borough of Falmouth and the Rural District of St. Austell which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st July, 1957, have now been prepared and are available for inspection at my office at the County Hall, Truro.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BARROW-IN-FURNESS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Rights of Way Map and Statement prepared under section 27 of the above-mentioned Act, in relation to the Rights of Way within the area of the said Council by the addition of two ways to be shown in the Draft Rights of Way Map namely—7(A) a public road used mainly as a footpath, commencing at Sowerby Lodge Farm and then running in a westward direction across Lodge Green to terminate on the foreshore.

7(B) a public footpath, commencing on the foreshore at the termination of route 7(A) and running in a westward and then in a northward direction over the foreshore to the Borough Boundary.

The two ways are shown on a map which has been deposited at the Borough Engineer and Surveyor's Office, Town Hall, Barrow-in-Furness, and which may be seen there, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. each day from Monday to Friday.

Any representation or objection with respect to this determination, shall be made in writing addressed to the undersigned at the Town Hall, Barrow-in-Furness, before the 30th September, 1957, and shall state the grounds on which it is made.

Extinguishment Order, 1957.*
