URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF TONBRIDGE.

Urban District of Tonbridge (Tonbridge No. 80 (part)) Footpath Extinguishment Order, 1957.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 20th day of August, 1957, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the South-East Ward of the Urban District of Tonbridge.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the public right of way which runs along the rear of properties on the east side of Deakin Leas and in the private access road to the County Grammar School for Girls, commencing at the junction of the said right of way with the new footpath from the southern end of Deakin Leas at the rear of No. 107, Deakin Leas and running in a northerly direction along the rear of the properties on the east side of Deakin Leas for a distance of approximately 273 yards at an average width of approximately 11 feet to its junction with the private access road to the County Grammar School for Girls and thence in a westerly direction along the said private access road for a distance of approximately 47 yards at an average width of approximately 12 feet to the junction of the said private access road with Deakin Leas.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the offices of the Urban District Council of Tonbridge, Tonbridge Castle, Tonbridge, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and 9.30 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 12th day of October, 1957, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.

Borough of Falmouth and Rural District of St. Austell.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Maps and Statements showing all public rights of way in the Borough of Falmouth and the Rural District of St. Austell which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st July, 1957, have now been prepared and are available for inspection at my office at the County Hall, Truro.

Copies of the relevant Draft Maps and Statements relating to each of the above-mentioned areas are also available for inspection at the offices of the Local Authorities for those areas, and extracts relating to each Parish in the Rural District of St. Austell are available for inspection in those Parishes by arrangement with the Parish Clerk or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting.

Representations or objections in respect of the Draft Maps and Statements may be made at any time during the period ending on the 11th January, 1958. Such representations or objections must be in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Truro, and must state the grounds on which they are made.

A representation or objection that an additional path (or paths) subsists, should state the points between which it is alleged to subsist, and define the route.

It will greatly help all concerned if representations or objections regarding more than one path are made on separate sheets of paper headed with the name of the Local Authority, and followed (where there is objection to a path shown on the Draft Map) by the number on the Map against the path in question.
