*Rural Districts of Camelford and Launceston.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Maps and Statements showing all public rights of way in the Rural Districts of Camelford and Launceston which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st October, 1957, have now been prepared and are available for inspection at my office at the County Hall, Truro.

Copies of the relevant Draft Maps and Statements relating to each of the above-mentioned areas are also available for inspection at the office of the Local Authorities for those areas, and extracts relating to each Parish are available for inspection in those Parishes by arrangement with the Parish Clerk or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting.

Representations or objections in respect of the Draft Maps and Statements may be made at any time during the period ending on the 30th April, 1958. Such representations or objections must be in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Truro, and must state the grounds on which they are made.

A representation or objection that an additional path (or paths) subsists, should state the points between which it is alleged to subsist, and define the route.

It will greatly help all concerned if representations or objections regarding more than one path are made on separate sheets of paper headed with the name of the Local Authority, and followed (where there is objection to a path shown on the Draft Map) by the number on the Map against the path in question.

COUNTY OF THE SOKE OF PETERBOROUGH.

*Public Rights of Way.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of the Soke of Peterborough have prepared in accordance with section 32 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, a definitive map and statement of the public rights of way within such County.

The said map and statement may be inspected free of charge at the County Surveyor's Office in the Town Hall, Bridge Street, Peterborough, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays other than Saturdays and 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Relevant extracts from such map and statement relating to their respective areas have also been deposited for similar inspection free of charge during normal office hours at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Peterborough; at the Barnack Rural District Council Offices, Broad Street, Stamford; and at the Peterborough Rural District Council Offices, 51, Priestgate, Peterborough. In addition a copy of an extract from such map and statement relating to each individual parish affected has been forwarded to the Clerk of the Parish Council or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting as the case may be, with whom arrangements for inspection thereof at all reasonable hours may be made.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the definitive map and statement on the ground that the map is not within the powers of the Act, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the preparation of the map, may within 6 weeks from the date of this notice make an application to the High Court in accordance with the provisions of Part III of the First Schedule to the Act.

DEPOSIT OF THE DRAFT MAP—BRECONSHIRE—AREA 4.

*Survey of Rights of Way.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Draft Map and Statement indicating public rights of way in Area 4 of the County of Brecon have now been completed. The map is now on deposit within the areas of the respective County Districts as follows:—

(i) *Brecon Municipal Borough.* The Office of the Brecon Municipal Borough Council at Steeple Lane, Brecon.

(ii) *Brecknock Rural District.* The Office of the Divisional Road Surveyor, Sennybridge.

Additional copies of the map will be on deposit at the Offices of the County Council, County Hall, Brecon, and the Office of the Brecknock Rural District Council at Oxford House, The Watton, Brecon.

Inspection of these maps may be made at any place of deposit during normal office hours. In addition, special appointments for inspection may be arranged with the undersigned when inspection during normal office hours is not convenient.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, the maps will be on deposit until the 5th day of May, 1958. Until such date the owner of any land to which the Draft Map and Statement relate, or any other person interested in such land may require the Surveying Authority to specify within fourteen days the documentary evidence (if any) which was taken into account in preparing the Draft Map in relation to any rights of way shown on that map, and facilities for inspection of such documents shall be afforded.

All communications including any objections or representations specifying the Parish(es) to which the communication relates and quoting, if applicable, any appropriate Path Numbers appearing in the Draft Map should be received by the undersigned not later than the 5th day of May, 1958.

AYLESBURY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Parish of Ludgershall.*

No. 2 Diversion Order, 1957.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 27th day of November, 1957, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land in the parish of Ludgershall.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way which runs in a south-westerly direction through land, Ordnance Nos. 142 and 85 for a distance of 360 feet commencing at a point 110 feet south-east of the "Bull and Butcher" public house to a line running in a westerly direction for a distance of 210 feet from a point 335 feet south of the "Bull and Butcher" public house to a point 365 feet south-west of the "Bull and Butcher" public house and being the junction with the existing public right of way.

A certified copy of the Order and the map contained in the Order has been deposited at 43, Buckingham Street, Aylesbury, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 10th day of January, 1958, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
