

**THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947, AND THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1950.**

*The County of Lincoln, Parts of Lindsey (Restriction of Permitted Development, Gainsborough) Direction, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above-mentioned Direction has been made by the County Council of Lincoln, Parts of Lindsey, and was approved by the Minister of Housing and Local Government on 23rd January, 1957.

The Direction relates to the land specified in the First Schedule hereto. Copies of the Direction and the map defining the area to which it relates may be seen at the County Offices, Lincoln, and at the Offices of the Gainsborough Urban District Council, 6, Lord Street, Gainsborough, Lincs, at all reasonable hours.

The effect of the Direction is as follows. From the date hereof until the Direction is cancelled or varied, the development of the said land which is permitted by the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950, and specified in Class VI of the First Schedule to the Order, details of which are set out in the Second Schedule hereto, may not be undertaken except upon the grant of planning permission by the local planning authority or the Minister of Housing and Local Government upon an application for planning permission.

**THE FIRST SCHEDULE.**

An area of land situated partly on the east side and partly on the west side of The Avenue in the Urban District of Gainsborough, bounded on the north in part by The Belt Road and in part by The Little Belt and comprising Ordnance Survey enclosures 43, 44, 45 and the eastern portion of 41 (Sheets XLII.8 and XLIII.5).

**THE SECOND SCHEDULE.**

1. The carrying out of building or engineering operations requisite for the use of the land for the purposes of agriculture.

2. The erection or construction and the maintenance, improvement or other alteration of roadside stands for milk churns.

3. The winning and working, on land held or occupied with land used for the purposes of agriculture, of any minerals required for the purposes of that use, including the fertilisation of the land so used and the maintenance, improvement or alteration of buildings or works thereon which are occupied or used for the purposes aforesaid.

Applications to Quarter Sessions should be in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the

Peace, County Hall, Truro, and should reach him not later than the 9th March, 1957. Any such application should be made in accordance with the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952, and sections 29 to 31 of the above-named Act.

**DEVIZES RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.**

*Strawberry Hill to White Street, West Lavington, Footpath Extinguishment Order, 1956.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 28th day of January, 1957, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way from Strawberry Hill to White Street at the rear of Speke Cottages and Tau Cross in the Parish of West Lavington. The extinguishment will take effect from the 12th day of February, 1957.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at Browfort, Devizes, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays except Saturdays, and on Saturdays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon.

The Order becomes operative as from the 7th day of February, 1957, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

**HARTISMERE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.**

*The Rural District Council of Hartismere (Parish of Mendlesham No. 1) Diversion Order, 1957.*
