LLANDEILO RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Llandeilo Rural District (Bridge Street—King's Road, Llandybie, Footpath) Extinguishment Order, 1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 22nd day of March, 1958, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in Llandybie Ward of the Parish of Llandybie in the county of Carmarthen.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the public right of way from Bridge Street to King's Road in the village of Llandybie.

NORTHLEACH RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Northleach Rural District Council (Dean Farm—Sheepbridge Barn) Extinguishment Order, 1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 19th day of March, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish on the 2nd day of April, 1958, the public right-of-way which runs from a point due south of Dean Farm Cottages, Coln St. Aldwyn, in a south easterly direction to the point where it terminates at the Hatherop—Eastleach Road near Sheepbridge Barn, Eastleach.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Northleach Rural District Council, High Street, Northleach, Glos, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., each weekday except Saturdays, and between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays, and has also been deposited with the Clerk of the Coln St. Aldwyn Parish Council at Park Lodge, Coln St. Aldwyn, and the Clerk of the Eastleach Parish Council at Witney Cottage, Eastleach, where

these documents will be open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 28th day of March, 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

NORTHAMPTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Northampton Rural District Council, Cogenhoe, Denton No. 1, Diversion Order, 1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 19th day of March, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government, confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from Whiston Slade from a point 180 feet from the south eastern corner of O.S. 99 in a south westerly direction for a distance of 1,330 feet approx. in the parishes of Cogenhoe and Denton to a line running in a south westerly direction for a distance of 835 feet or thereabouts crossing the brook on the eastern boundary of O.S. 161 continuing in a westerly direction for a distance of 575 feet or thereabouts and joining the original line of the public right of way. The old path will be closed at the expiration of 41 days from the date of confirmation of the Order by the Minister.

A certified copy of the Order and of the Map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, 1, Cheyne Walk, Northampton, and will be open for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 28th day of March, 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
