	12	Delete part of bridleway from a point approximately 240 yards from the eastern end of the private accommodation road west of Lower Luckdon south-westwards through woodland to Parish Boundary. Add bridleway from a point approximately 240 yards from the eastern end of the said private accommodation road passing along the southern side of the overgrown lane, again re-entering the private accommodation road and continuing to Easdon Down, and across Down to join Manaton B.R. 12 at Parish Boundary.
	16	Add road used as a public path from east side of Fairbrook Bridge to road approximately 600 yards west of Dickford Bridge.
	17	Add footpath over bridge across River Bovey alongside road above mentioned.
Stokeinteighhead...	4	Delete whole of path from Stokeinteighhead to Teighnarvey via Mill Bottom Lane.
Teigngrace ...	8	Add footpath from Teign Bridge along western bank of River Teign to Parish Boundary (joins Kingsteignton Footpath No. 13).
Torbryan ...	2	Delete whole of path from Torbryan Hill to road south of Tornewton, via Old Rectory.

Survey of Public Rights of Way
