

WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Southam Rural District

Notice is hereby given that the Warwickshire County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sub-section 3 of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the draft rights of way map and statement prepared under section 27 of the above mentioned Act in relation to rights of way in the Southam Rural District, by altering to "bridleway" the description of the ways, described as "road used as a public path", referred to in the First Schedule hereto by the number allotted to them in the said draft rights of way map and statement, and by altering to "footpath" the description of the ways, described as "road used as a public path", referred to in the Second Schedule hereto by the said numbers.

Copies of the draft rights of way map and statement for the said district may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Shire Hall, Warwick, and at the offices of the Southam Rural District Council, The Grange, Southam.

Any representation or objection with respect to any of these determinations shall be made in writing addressed to the Clerk of the Warwickshire County Council, Shire Hall, Warwick, before the 15th day of May 1959, and shall state the grounds upon which it is made.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Roads used as public paths to be shown as bridleways

SM.4, SM.13a, SM.42, SM.53 from the Napton—Marston Doles Road to the Marston Doles—In Meadow Gate Road, SM.53, SM.77, SM.80, SM.93, SM.96, from the boundary of the parish of Priors Hardwick eastwards for a distance of 1,400 yards, SM.170a, SM.171, for a distance of 150 yards at its western end.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Roads used as public paths to be shown as footpaths

SM.17a, SM.26, from Northfields to its southern end, SM.50 from the disused windmill to its southern end, SM.50a, SM.59, SM.62b, SM.68a, for a distance of 430 yards at its western end. SM.81c, SM.95, SM.96a from the boundary of the parish of Lower Radbourne westwards to its junction with SM.96, SM.115, SM.133, SM.157 for a distance of 100 yards at its eastern end.

RUGBY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Rural District of Rugby (Shilton Footpath) (No. 1) Extinguishment Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that on the 8th day of April 1959, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way from a point 56 yards north of Shilton School to Wood Lane, Shilton east of the Vicarage as from the 7th day of May 1959.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, 24 Warwick Street, Rugby, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. (9 a.m. to 12 noon Saturdays).

The Order becomes operative as from the 17th day of April 1959, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

| 12 | Add footpath from north-eastern end of footpath No. 12 passing under the railway line to Smuggler's Lane. |
| 22 | Delete whole of path from Dawlish—Teignmouth road north of Country House (P.H.) to Oak Hill Cross Road south of Oak Hill Cross. |
| 27 | Delete part of path from Holcombe Down Road to Lidwell Chapel, via Lidwell Farm. |
| 29 | Delete whole of path from Warren Road to Orchard Lane/Sandy Lane junction, via Eastdon Wood. |
| 31 | Delete whole of path from Haldon Lodge to road west of Lower Southwood, via Smallacombe Farm. |
| 32 | Delete whole of path from road south of Castle Dyke to Smallacombe Farm, via Smallacombe Goyle. |

These paths are shown on a map which has been deposited at the respective offices of the Clerk of the County Council at The Castle, Exeter, and the Acting Clerk of the Urban District Council at The Manor House, Dawlish, and may be seen there free of charge during the usual office hours.

BRIDGWATER RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Bridgwater Rural District Council (Durleigh) Footpath Diversion Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th day of April 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from existing footbridge crossing Durleigh Brook in Field O.S. No. 50 through Durleigh Farm and Durleigh Church Yard to the Enmore—Bridgwater County Road to a line running west from the existing footbridge to stile between Field O.S. 50 and Orchard O.S. 49 and thence on an irregular course on the Southern side of Durleigh Brook to the Enmore—Bridgwater County Road. The existing footpath will be closed as from 20th April 1959, from which date the new footpath will be brought into use.
