Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sub-Section (3) of Section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Rights of Way Map and Statements prepared under Section 27 of the above mentioned Act in relation to the rights of way in the South Molton Rural District within the area of the said Council as follows:

Parish	Path No.	Modification
Bishopsnympton ...	15	Delete whole of path from the road south-east of Sannacott to road near Rawstone Bridge, via Whitechapel Barton and Southill Cottage.
Burrington ...	18	Add footpath from road south of School to road at Comrade's Hut.
Chittlehampton ...	7	Delete whole of path from road south-east of Ambow Farm to road by Court Wood, via Ambow and Blackdown Wood.
	20	Delete whole of path from the road north-east of Deptford Bridge to road by Court Wood, via Court.
Chulmleigh ...	15	Add footpath from East Street to Park Mill Road (Academic Lane).
Molland ...	27	Delete part of path from road at Bottreaux Mill to West Barton. Add footpath from road south of Bommer Bridge along southern side of railway line to West Barton.
Romansleigh ...	6	Add bridleway from Buckham Hill to Odham Cross, via Furzehill Cottage and Odham Wood.

These paths are shown on a Map which has been deposited at the respective offices of the Clerk of the County Council at The Castle, Exeter, and the Clerk of the Rural District Council at South Molton, and may be seen there free of charge during the usual office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to this determination shall be made in writing addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, The Castle, Exeter, on or before the 18th day of January 1960, and shall state the grounds on which it is made.

BARNARD CASTLE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Barnard Castle Rural District Council, Hude, Middleton-in-Teesdale Diversion Order, 1959

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 8th day of December 1959, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate at Hude in the Parish of Middleton-in-Teesdale in the County of Durham.

The effect of the Order will be to divert that part of the public right of way running from Unclassified Road 39/3, Hude, Middleton-in-Teesdale to the Middleton-in-Teesdale-Alston Road for a distance of 105 feet approximately from Unclassified Road 39/3 at the North Corner of the Common Yard of Nos. 4, 5 and 6 Hude to a line running from a point 25 feet North-westwards of the aforementioned point in a South-westerly direction for 100 feet approximately thence in a South-easterly direction for 31 feet to join with the existing path.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Council Offices, 43 Galgate, Barnard Castle, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays and from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

POCKLINGTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Pocklington Rural District Youlthorpe Green Points Diversion Order 1959

Notice is hereby given that on the 3rd day of December 1959 the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from Full Sutton to Youlthorpe being that part lying across land at Green Points, Youlthorpe, from its present line across Field No. 74 Ordnance Survey Sheet, Yorkshire East Riding CLIX.13 (Edition of 1910) to a line running along

the eastern, northern and western boundaries of the field. The existing path will be closed on the 24th day of December 1959.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Grove House, Pocklington and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 15th day of December 1959, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
