## RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF OAKHAM

*The Oakham Rural District Council (Hambleton No. 2 Footpath) Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that on the 21st day of January 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way on foot, leading from a point in the western boundary wall of the churchyard at Hambleton westwards across field O.S. No. 82 for about 164 yards and ending at the fence in the north western boundary hedge of this field, to a line leading from the said point in the western boundary wall of Hambleton Churchyard proceeding in turn in a northerly and westerly direction along the line of the hedge which forms part of the eastern and northern boundaries of field O.S. No. 82 for a distance of about 220 yards and ending at the aforesaid fence in the north western boundary hedge of the field. The existing public right of way will be closed on the 11th day of February 1960.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at R.D.C. Offices, Catmose, Oakham, and will be open for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 29th day of January 1960, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
