

(b) the revised map and statement in draft form has been deposited at the offices of the County Surveyor, Aykley Heads, Durham, where it may be inspected at all reasonable hours;

(c) a copy of so much of the revised map and statement in draft form as relates to (i) each borough and urban district area in the County affected thereby has been deposited at the offices of each of the borough or urban district councils whose area it concerns; (ii) each rural district area in the County affected thereby has been deposited at the place set out opposite to each area specified in the Second Schedule hereto and (iii) each parish in the County affected thereby has so far as practicable been deposited for the convenience of the public with the Chairman or Clerk of the respective Parish Councils or in those cases where a Parish has no Council with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting, where it may be inspected at all reasonable hours;

(d) subject to the provisions of section 32 (4) of the Act representations or objections as to anything contained in or omitted from the revised map and statement in draft form may be made to the Council; and

(e) any such representation or objection should be made in writing and sent to the undersigned so as to reach him not later than the 21st January 1963, and should state in full the nature of the representation or objection, the grounds upon which it is made and the right of way it concerns.

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council, in accordance with the provisions of section 30 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have prepared a Provisional Map and Statement in respect of the Rural District of Launceston.

Copies of the Provisional Map and Statement have been deposited at the office of the County Planning Officer, County Hall, Truro, and at the office of the Clerk of the Rural District Council, 20 Western Road, Launceston, where they may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Copies of the Maps and Statements relating to each of the Parishes in the Rural District are also available for inspection in those Parishes by arrangement with the Clerk of the Parish Council or with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting where there is no Parish Council.

Any owner, lessee or occupier of land shown on the Map to which this notice relates, being land on which the Map shows a public path or road used as a public path, may apply to Quarter Sessions for the deletion of any such path from the Map or for any of the declarations referred to in section 31 of the Act. Applications to Quarter Sessions should be in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Truro, and should reach him not later than 12th October 1962. Any such applications should be made in accordance with the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952, and sections 29 to 31 of the above-named Act.
