Survey of Public Rights of Way Draft Revised Map and Statement

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Rochdale, in exercise of their powers conferred upon them by sections 27-34 of the National Parks & Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have prepared a Revised Draft Map of the area showing thereon footpaths, bridleways and roads used as public footpaths. A copy of the map and a statement containing information relevant thereto may be inspected at the Borough Architect's Office, Church Lane, Rochdale, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Mondays-Fridays). A copy of the map may also

be inspected at the Art Gallery (Hallway), The Esplanade, Rochdale, between 9 a.m. and 8 p.m. (Mondays-Saturdays) and 2.30 p.m. to 5 p.m. (Sundays) and at the following Branch Libraries:

Any owner, lessee or occupier of land over which any of the paths run may apply to the Quarter Sessions for a determination of any dispute concerning the contents of the map and statement.

Notice of any such applications should be given in writing to the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions for the County Palatine of Lancaster, Quarter Sessions House, Preston, within 4 months after the publication of this notice, and shall specify the land to which the application relates, the grounds upon which the application is made, and the name of the reviewing authority, i.e. Rochdale County Borough Council, and the applicant shall serve a copy of such notice on every other person appearing to the applicant to be the owner, lessee or occupier of the said land or of any other land specified in the application in regard to which the Court may make a declaration, and upon the Rochdale County Borough Council addressed to the Town Clerk, Town Hall, Rochdale. Applicants should consult the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations 1952 (S.I. 1952 No. 559).

A	Footpath.	From Newbridge Lane running in a general north-easterly direction to join the Truro—Redruth Road (A.390), at the County Secondary Modern School.
B	Footpath.	From south of Boscawen Park Tearooms on the Truro—Malpas Road (Class III), leading in a general north-easterly direction to Park Farm accommodation road, thence via the Farm in a northerly direction to the junction of B.R.3.

9	Footpath.	From opposite Albion Place to High Cross, north side of Cathedral, Truro: Amended so that the exercise of the public right of way on foot on that section of the path between the two pedestrian gates is limited to the following times: from 6 a.m. to Sunset during May, June, July and August and from 7 a.m. to Sunset for the remainder of the year.
