*Rural District of West Penwith*

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council, in accordance with the provisions of section 30 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have prepared a Provisional Map and Statement in respect of the Rural District of West Penwith.

Copies of the Provisional Map and Statement have been deposited at the office of the County Planning Officer, County Hall, Truro, and at the office of the Clerk of the Rural District Council, 38 Chapel Street, Penzance, where they may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Copies of the Maps and Statements relating to each of the Parishes in the Rural District are also available for inspection in those Parishes by arrangement with the Clerk of the Parish Council or with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting where there is no Parish Council.

Any owner, lessee or occupier of land shown on the map to which this notice relates, being land on which the Map shows a public path or a road used as a public path, may apply to Quarter Sessions for any of the declarations referred to in section 31 of the Act. Applications to Quarter Sessions should be in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Truro, and should reach him not later than 20th March 1967. Any such application should be made in accordance with the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952, and section 31 of the above-named Act.

*First Review of the Definitive Map*

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to the provisions of section 33 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, the Lancashire County Council have reviewed the particulars contained in the Definitive Rights of Way Map and Statement for the present area of the Administrative County having regard to events which occurred between the 1st January 1953 (the relevant date of the map) and the 1st September 1966, which they have determined as the date of review.

It appears to the County Council as respects the Urban Districts of Dalton-in-Furness, Droylsden, Grane, Little Lever and Trawden that a Revised Map and Statement prepared in accordance with the above-mentioned section would not differ from the Definitive Rights of Way Map and Statement and they do not intend to prepare a Revised Rights of Way Map and Statement in draft form for those Districts.

Representations that a Revised Map and Statement for the said Urban Districts would differ from the Definitive Rights of Way Map and Statement may be made in writing to the undersigned not later than the 7th April 1967, stating fully the reasons therefor.

## PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

*First Review of the Definitive Map*

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to the provisions of section 33 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, the Lancashire County Council have reviewed the particulars contained in the Definitive Rights of Way Map and Statement for the present area of the Administrative County having regard to events which occurred between the 1st January 1953 (the relevant date of the map) and the 1st September 1966, which they have determined as the date of review.

Following completion of the Review, the County Council have prepared a Revised Rights of Way Map

and Statement in draft form for the area referred to above (except for the areas of the Urban Districts of Dalton-in-Furness, Droylsden, Grange, Little Lever and Trawden), indicating the public rights of way which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st September 1966.

The Revised Map and Statement in draft form may be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive, at the County Hall, Preston (Room D5). Appropriate extracts from the Map and Statement have been supplied to each Borough, Urban (except Dalton-in-Furness, Droylsden, Grange, Little Lever and Trawden) and Rural District Council in the area covered by the map, and may be inspected by arrangement with those authorities. An extract relating to each Rural Parish has also been supplied to the Clerk to the Parish Council or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting, as appropriate, and may be inspected by arrangement with the persons concerned.

Subject to the provisions of section 32 (4) of the above-mentioned Act, representations or objections with respect to the revised map and statement in draft form may be made in writing to the undersigned not later than the 23rd June 1967, and should state fully the nature of such representation or objection, describe the path concerned and state the registered number (if any) of such path.

The purpose of this notice is to enable persons to make representations or objections to any proposed amendments shown on the Revised Map and Statement in draft form.

*Stopping up of Highway**Lantewey-Pantersbridge Road (Unclassified) at Lantewey, St. Neot*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of Cornwall as Highway Authority propose to apply to the Justices sitting in the Petty Sessional Division of Liskerrett at The Guildhall, Liskeard, on Wednesday, 22nd March 1967, at 10.30 a.m. for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, stopping up, subject to its reservation as a bridleway, a length of 387 yards of the Lantewey-Pantersbridge Road (Unclassified) at Lantewey, St. Neot, from Lantewey Farm Gate in a westerly direction to the west side of the ford at Milltown Mill in the Parishes of St. Neot and Warleggan in the Rural District of Liskeard, the County Council being of opinion that the said road is unnecessary for vehicular traffic.

A plan showing the effect of the proposed Order is available for public inspection, free of charge, at the County Hall, Truro, and at the County Council's Divisional Surveyor's Office at Barn Street, Liskeard, during normal office hours from Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any person who would be aggrieved by the making of the Order has a right to attend and be heard on the application.
