Persons making an objection or representation may register their names and addresses with the Oxfordshire County Council and will then be entitled to receive notice of any amendment of the Development Plan made as a result of the proposals.

NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949

CHESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with the above-mentioned Act, the Cheshire County Council have prepared a provisional map and statement of the public footpaths, bridleways and roads used as public paths for that part of the county comprising the boroughs of Dukinfield, Hyde and Stalybridge; the urban districts of Bredbury and Romiley, Cheadle and Gatley, Hazel Grove and Bramhall, Longdendale and Marple; and the Rural Districts of Disley and Tintwistle.

The owner, lessee or occupier of any land on which the map shows a public path or a road used as a public path, may apply to quarter sessions for a declaration that at the relevant date there was no public right of way over the land, or that the map or statement is incorrect in some other respect. A copy of section 31 (1) of the above Act, which sets out the extent of this right of appeal, can be inspected at the places of deposit together with an extract from the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952, specifying the matters to be included in the application and the requirements as to service of notice of the application on other persons.

All applications to quarter sessions for a declaration must be made in writing to the Clerk of the Peace at County Hall, Chester, within twenty-eight days after the publication of this notice. A copy of any such application must also be sent to the undersigned.
