

Copies of the Definitive Map and Statement have been deposited at the office of the County Planning Officer, County Hall, Truro and at the offices of the Clerk of the Rural District Council, River Street, Truro where they may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours. Copies of the Maps and Statements relating to each of the Parishes in the Rural District are also available for inspection in those Parishes by arrangement with the Clerk of the Parish Council or with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting where there is no Parish Council.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Definitive Map on the ground that the Map is

not within the powers of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the preparation of the Map or of any draft or provisional map on which that Map is based, may within six weeks after the date of publication of this notice make an application to the High Court in accordance with the provisions of Part III of the First Schedule to the Act.

CHESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with the above-mentioned Act, the Cheshire County Council have prepared a provisional map and statement of the public footpaths, bridleways and roads used as public paths for that part of the County comprising the Boroughs of Altrincham and Sale; the Urban Districts of Alderley Edge, Bowdon, Hale, Knutsford, Lymm, Runcorn and Wilmslow; and the Rural Districts of Bucklow and Runcorn.

The map and statement have been deposited in the office of the County Surveyor at Backford Hall, near Chester, and may be inspected there during normal office hours (not Saturdays). In the case of the Rural Districts of Bucklow and Runcorn an extract from the map and statement, so far as it relates to each parish, has also been deposited with the Clerk of the Parish Council or in the case where a parish has no Council the Chairman or Clerk of the Parish Meeting or the representative for the parish on the Rural District Council, and may be similarly inspected at all reasonable times by reference to the Clerk or Chairman or parish representative, as the case may be.

The owner, lessee or occupier of any land on which the map shows a public path or a road used as a public path, may apply to quarter sessions for a declaration that at the relevant date there was no public right of way over the land, or that the map or statement is incorrect in some other respect. A copy of section 31 (1) of the above Act, which sets out the extent of this right of appeal, can be inspected at the places of deposit together with an extract from the Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952, specifying the matters to be included in the application and the requirements as to service of notice of the application on other persons.

All applications to quarter sessions for a declaration must be made in writing to the Clerk of the Peace at County Hall, Chester, not later than the 12th February 1968. A copy of any such application must also be sent to the undersigned.

ALFRETON URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Public Path Diversion Order—Highways Act 1959. Alfreton Urban District Council—Cotes Park Somercotes Footpath (No. 6) Division Order, 1967.

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 7th day of November 1967, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert part of footpath No. 6 running from Birchwood Road, Alfreton, to Cotes Park Lane, Somercotes, being a part which starts approximately 80 yards north-west of Cotes Park House and runs south-east for a distance of 383 yards to the paths junction with Bridle Road No. 9 known as Cotes Park Lane near the site of the former Cotes Park Colliery onto a line which starts at the same point 80 yards north-west of Cotes Park House and runs first in an easterly direction for a distance of 127 yards then south-south-east for a distance of 354 yards to join Bridle Road No. 9 known as Cotes Park Lane at a point approximately 100 yards north of Cotes Park Farm.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council offices, Nottingham Road, Alfreton, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (inclusive).
