The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of the public right of way footpath T.58 running from Stapleton Lane (Route B.5325) Barwell in the Urban District of Hinckley to Stapleton Lane, Daddlington which extends from a point approximately 30 yards west of its junction with Stapleton Lane (Route B.5325) Barwell in the north-east corner of O.P. No. 0026 in a generally westerly direction across that parcel for a distance of approximately 467 yards to a point on the western boundary of O.P. No. 0026 to a line running from the point 30 yards west of the junction of Stapleton Lane (Route B.5325) previously described, in a generally north-westerly direction to follow the north-eastern boundary of O.P. No. 0026 for a distance of approximately 513 yards to a point in the north-west corner of that parcel, thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of O.P. No. 0026 for a distance of approximately 113 yards to rejoin the existing path at the point on the western boundary of O.P. No. 0026 previously described.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent, in writing to the Clerk of Leicestershire County Council, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester, LE3 8RA, not later than the 22nd day of November 1973, and should state the grounds on which it is made. If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Leicestershire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210
*Leicestershire County Council (Footpath W.16A Enderby)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1973*

Notice is hereby given that on the 18th October 1973, the Leicestershire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert that part of the public right of way Footpath W.16A running from Leicester Lane to Old Fosse Way in the Parish of Enderby to a line extending from the south side of Leicester Lane, Enderby, Route B.5365, approximately 193 yards west of its junction with Narborough Road South, in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 195 yards to join the existing path at its junction with the Old Fosse Way.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Leicestershire County Council and may be inspected free of charge at Room 210, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester, during normal office hours.

Diversion Order 1973*

Notice is hereby given that on the 16th October 1973, the Lancashire County Council confirmed the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert that part of footpath No. 152 Darwen, commencing at a point 166 yards east of Moss Gap Cottages, off Bolton Road, Darwen, and running in a generally easterly direction over Bull Hill Tip to "Stepping Stones", to a line commencing at the same point east of Moss Gap Cottages, to the north of the original footpath, and running in a generally easterly direction for some 500 yards and joining the original footpath at "Stepping Stones".

COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1968

Revised Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council have carried out a limited special review of the Definitive Map and Statement of public rights of way pursuant to Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, and the Countryside Act, 1968, which requires roads used as public paths to be reclassified by one of the three following descriptions:

- (a) a "byway open to all traffic"
- (b) a "bridleway"
- (c) a "footpath".

A revised map and statement in draft form for the whole of the Administrative County has now been prepared and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the office of the County Planning Officer, County Hall, Truro.
