

Other Routes with Public Access

Natural England (Out in the Country *file/79047*)

“There are no special rights attached to the depiction by OS of a route as an other route with public access. However the route’s inclusion in the highway authority’s list of maintainable highways means that the authority regards it as a highway. In many cases such a route is likely to be a carriageway, and thus open to all users, but if in doubt check with the highway authority.”

Ordnance Survey definition

These are routes that are rights of way; however, the exact nature of the routes is unclear and is based on the best information that Ordnance Survey has to hand. Prior to setting out on one of these routes, you may want to contact the local highway authority to see if they can advise on any restrictions that there may be.
